## Gapyeong Battle Memorial Ceremony to be Held on the 24<sup>th</sup> with Revisiting Commonwealth Veterans

- On April 24th at 10 AM, a memorial ceremony will be held at the Commonwealth monument in Gapyeong, Gyeonggi Province. Following the ceremony, memorial services will take place at each nation's monument.
- 6 Korean War veterans and 15 family members from 4 Commonwealth countries currently revisiting Korea, including a Canadian veteran who fought in the Battle of Gapyeong will join the ceremony.
- Vice Minister Hee-wan Lee stated, "We will never forget to repay the sacrifices and dedication of our heroes and make concerted efforts to ensure that the history of their service acts as a bridge connecting South Korea with the UN Sending States."

[Korea, April 23] A memorial ceremony will be held to honor the contributions and commemorate the sacrifices of veterans who fought in the Battle of Gapyeong (Kapyong), one of the fiercest battles of the Korean War.

The Ministry of Patriots and Veterans Affairs (Minister Kang Jung-ai) announced that the ceremony, hosted by the British Embassy in Korea and attended by veterans and family members from four Commonwealth countries (the United Kingdom, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand), will take place on April 24<sup>th</sup>, 10 AM at the Commonwealth Monument in Gapyeong County, Gyeonggi Province.

The Battle of Gapyeong occurred from April 23 to 25, 1951, where approximately 2,000 soldiers of the 27th British Commonwealth Brigade successfully fought against a Chinese force over five times their size. This victory significantly contributed to the establishment of new defensive positions by the South Korean and UN forces.

The ceremony will be attended by several dignitaries, including the Vice Minister of Patriots and Veterans Affairs, the Deputy Commander of the United Nations Command, ambassadors from the United Kingdom, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand, the governor of Gapyeong County, and the commander of the 66th Infantry Division. Among the visiting veterans is William John Chrysler, a Canadian veteran who fought in the Battle of Gapyeong during the Korean War. He plans to honor the sacrifice and dedication of his comrades during the ceremony. Additionally, Viki M.

Armour, the daughter of the late Eric C. Lawther, an Australian veteran of the Gapyeong battle, will also attend. Vikki, an Australian music teacher, is known to teach the song "Arirang" during her classes to commemorate the UN veterans.

The ceremony will include an opening speech, entrance of the UN color guard, a reading of a message from the British monarch, His Majesty King Charles III, commemorative speeches by the Deputy Commander of the UN Command, the Vice Minister of Patriots and Veterans Affairs, and the commander of the 66th Infantry Division, a memorial service, a moment of silence, wreath-laying, the exit of the UN color guard, and closing remarks, and will last about one hour.

Following the Commonwealth Memorial Ceremony of the Battle of Gapyeong, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand will hold national memorial ceremonies in front of the Canadian monument and Australia-New Zealand monument at 11:30AM, each lasting 40 minutes. Additionally, on the 25th, the Australian and New Zealand Embassies will host the Anzac Day Ceremony at the War Memorial of Korea to honor the allied forces of Australia and New Zealand.

- Agenda: Didgeridoo performance (an Australian traditional wind instrument developed by the indigenous people of Northern Australia), opening speech, entrance of the Australian Federation Guard, memorial service, remarks by Australian and New Zealand representatives, wreath-laying, poetry recital, exit of the Australian Federation Guard, scholarship presentation to Gapyeong High School, closing ceremony.

Vice Minister Hee-wan Lee emphasized that South Korea's freedom and prosperity were only possible thanks to the courage and fighting spirit of the 1.99 million UN veterans, including over two thousand Commonwealth heroes who defended Gapyeong during the Korean War. He affirmed that the Ministry of Patriots and Veterans Affairs will never forget to repay the sacrifices and dedication of the heroes and make concerted efforts to ensure that the history of their service acts as a bridge connecting South Korea with the UN Sending States.
